This project should be taken at least 2 years, completing 21 of the required and optional activities before proceeding to Level 4.

- 1. Select a woodworking project helper.
- 2. Complete all four (4) steps of the Nailing It Together Planning Guide (page 3) Project Goals, Leadership Experiences, Project Highlights, and Project Review.
- 3. Complete the minimum number of Achievement Program activities each year.
- 4. Do at least four (4) Leadership Experiences each year.
- 5. Create a notebook or scrapbook containing:
 - a. Answers to the Share What Happened questions you discussed with your helper.
 - b. Include results or answers if you choose to do some of the More Challenges activities.
 - A list of materials used to construct your project including a cost analysis of each item.
- 6. Make two (2) items from the book or using similar skills with the following tools and techniques: miter or bevel cutting; lathing; dadoing; rabbeting; staining; using dowel joint. The completed article should be sanded, painted, or varnished and dry **before** Interview Judging.
- (OPTIONAL) Neatly create an educational poster describing some aspect of your project.
- 8. Bring to Interview Judging:
 - a. Neat and complete project book.
 - b. Be able to discuss any information from the project book.
 - c. The educational poster (optional).
 - d. Your notebook or scrapbook.
 - e. Two items made from the book.
 - f. Know the 4-H Pledge, 4-H Motto, and 4-H Colors.
- 9. Exhibit in club's fair booth if you and your advisor so choose:
 - a. The educational poster presented at Interview Judging.
 - b. Wood piece(s) made.
 - c. Notebook or scrapbook.
