

692 Growing With the Seasons

1. Read and understand the project book.
2. Follow the Project Guidelines as outlined on Page 3 of project book.
3. Neatly create a garden notebook including items such as:
 - a. A log of activities performed in your garden with the dates the task was complete.
 - b. Photos of the different stages of development in your garden from soil preparation to harvest.
 - c. Include any useful reference material collected throughout completion of the project.
4. Neatly create an educational exhibit or poster illustrating and describing some aspect of your project. Your name and club name need to be visible on the front of the display.
5. Bring to Interview Judging:
 - a. Neat and complete project book.
 - b. Be able to discuss any information from the project book.
 - c. Bring four (4) varieties of vegetables harvested from the garden and properly exhibited according to project book. Be able to give proper characteristics for each variety.
 - d. The garden notebook.
 - e. Educational exhibit or poster.
 - f. Know the 4-H Pledge, 4-H Motto, and 4-H Colors.
6. Exhibit in club's fair booth if you and your advisor so choose:
 - a. The educational exhibit or poster from Interview Judging.
 - b. The garden notebook. This needs to be opened to a page showing parts of your project. (Project book does not qualify as an exhibit.)
 - c. No real food is permitted to be displayed in the fair booth!
