755 Muzzle Loading (Shooting Sports)

Ohio 4-H strongly recommends youth complete a rifle, pistol, or shotgun project before taking muzzleloader.

This is a leader-directed program to be taught by Certified Shooting Sports volunteers **only**. Members **must** enroll through local club and attend 80% of Shooting Sports club training meetings directed by certified leaders.

- 1. Read and understand the project book.
- 2. Complete General Project Guidelines as listed on Page 4 of project book.
- 3. Neatly create an educational exhibit or poster illustrating and describing one aspect of your project. Your name and club name need to be visible on the front of the display. Examples include but are not limited to: topic report; performance record or photos showing a learning process or technique learned or skill learned.
- Bring to Interview Judging:
 - a. Neat and completed project book.
 - b. Be able to discuss any information from the project book.
 - c. Educational exhibit or poster.
 - d. Know the 4-H Pledge, 4-H Motto, and 4-H Colors.
 - e. No type of gun and/or weapon is to be brought to Interview Judging!
- 5. Exhibit in club's fair booth if you and your advisor so choose:
 - a. The educational exhibit or poster from Interview Judging. (Project book **does not** qualify as an exhibit.)
 - b. No type of gun and/or weapon is to be exhibited at the fair!
